

# **Wildlife Feeding Regulation**

## **Village OF Pelly**

### **BYLAW NO. 01-2026**

#### **A BYLAW TO PROHIBIT THE INTENTIONAL FEEDING OR LEAVING FOOD ATTRACTANTS FOR WILD ANIMALS INCLUDING WILD UNGULATES**

The Council of the Village of Pelly in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw may be referenced as the “Wildlife Feeding Regulation”
2. For the purpose of this bylaw, the expression:
  - (a) “wildlife / wild animals” means all amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals, specifically wild ungulates, animals not normally domesticated.
  - (b) “administrator” shall mean the administrator of the municipality;
  - (c) “council” shall mean the council of the municipality;
  - (d) “designated officer” shall mean that person designated by the council of the municipality;
  - (e) “municipality” shall mean the Village of Pelly;
  - (f) “Bylaw Enforcement Officer” shall mean the person appointed as animal enforcement officer by the council of the municipality;
  - (g) “peace officer” shall mean a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Conservation Officer and any person appointed as a Bylaw Officer as appointed by the Village to enforce bylaws of the village.
3. No resident shall intentionally feed wildlife, including wild ungulates or leave food or attractants of any type or in any form outdoors in such a manner as to attract or be accessible by a wild animal, feral or stray domestic animal on private or public property.
  - (a) Section 3 does not apply to the feeding of songbirds on a property, provided the following feeding requirements are met by the owner or occupier;
  - (b) Seed is placed in a bird feeding device that is sufficiently above the ground as to not to attract or be accessible by wild animals; and bird feeding practices do not attract large flocks of homing birds such as wild, feral or domesticated pigeons; and
  - (c) Spillage of seed upon the ground is removed by the property owner or occupier forthwith and disposed of in such a manner that it does not attract wild animals, feral or stray domestic animals.
4. Wildlife attractant means any substance which could, or be reasonably expected to, attract wild ungulates or other wildlife including but not limited to:
  - (a) Food for domesticated animals or livestock including, but not limited to:
    - i. Pet food
    - ii. Livestock food
  - (b) Food for birds including, but not limited to
    - i. birdseed
    - ii. suet,
    - iii. hummingbird nectar,
    - iv. honey
  - (c) Compost waste,
  - (d) Salt,
  - (e) Food for human consumption,
  - (f) Residential garbage,
  - (g) Waste,
  - (h) Recycled material,

- (i) Restaurant grease,
- (j) Ash,
- (k) Petroleum products
- (l) Antifreeze,
- (m) Paint,
- (n) Outdoor refrigerators or freezers

5. No person shall store, handle or dispose of any wildlife attractants in such a manner so that they are or may become accessible to ungulates or other wildlife.
6. No person shall feed, attempt to feed or permit feeding of, either directly or indirectly, any ungulates or other wildlife by leaving or placing, in, on or about any premises, any wildlife attractants for the purpose of feeding such ungulates or other wildlife.

**PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT:**

7. No person shall willfully obstruct, hinder or interfere with a Bylaw Enforcement Officer, Conservation officer, or any other person authorized to enforce and engaged in the enforcement of the provision of this Bylaw.
8. Any person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offense and subject to a fine no less than \$600.00 (six hundred dollars) for each violation, payable to the Village. Payment of the penalty is to be paid within 30 days of receipt.
9. Any person who contravenes this Bylaw will be subject to a fine, and inquiry by the Saskatchewan Conservation Office.

**COMING INTO FORCE:**

10. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of its enactment.
